THIS Priory of Black Canons was founded to the Honour of the holy Trinity, the Blessed Virgin, St. Michael and all Saints, by W<sup>m</sup>. Clinton Earl of Huntingdon, Anno. 1337. He appointed several ordinances relating to their Habit, The Election of a Prior, The order of the house, the quality and number of Canons, with many other injunctions; all which were confirm'd by Roger Bp' of Coventry & Lichfield, King Edn<sup>d</sup>. III, granted Licences to these Canons to exchange their Mannor at Shustoke for certain Lands in Maxstoke. Valued at the dissolution £87. 12s. 3½ d. Dug. £120. 11s. 8d. Speeds.
